



PASTOR'S NOTE

Dear Saints.

Do you find yourself starving by 9am on Ash Wednesday, even if you normally don't even eat breakfast till then? Many people are familiar with this phenomenon, and some have suggested it's a vestige of primitive survival instincts: our body craves what our mind believes or knows to be scarce. So it's perfectly natural; the challenge is that it's *only natural*.


Left to innate impulses, we'd constantly be on the hunt to satisfy our every desire. Lent, then, is an opportunity to order our lives according to something other than that neverending chase. It's a chance to lift our minds and hearts to something higher.

St. Thomas Aquinas said that relying on purely material matters is like building with wood, while relying on spiritual and divine matters is like building with gold. There's nothing wrong with wood. God made wood and he found it very good. But wood decays, while gold endures.

We have four weeks left to experience a Lent centered on higher things. Let's commit ourselves to the discipline it requires so we can enjoy the freedom it offers. If we do, it won't be long before we're celebrating something even more precious than gold.





LEARNING THROUGH EXPLORATION

If you see our energetic pre-k students on the playground, you might be surprised at the ways in which they embrace the calm and order of their classroom! For young children crave both the flexibility of free play and structure and security of routines. Their teachers guide and assist each student to chose the activities, or "works," he will pursue. The students take pride in their work, from admiring their abilities to caring for the set -up and clean-up of their materials. The focus of learning at this age is primarily social, with students absorbing concepts like sharing, patience, and empathy through relationships with each other. But as they work within five key areas of study—practical life, sensorial, math, language, and culture—they are also developing foundational executive skills that will flourish throughout their education, skills such as self-control, organization, problem solving, focus, and observation.

These goals have been greatly enhanced this year by our Atrium, designed to support their growth and accommodate their particular needs! We are thankful to have such a bright and beautiful place to welcome our youngest learners.

LENTEN RETREAT WITH REFORM Saturday, March 9th




